 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pedestrian Safety
- 5 Study Act of 2020".

1	SEC. 2. STUDY ON EFFECTS OF HIGH-SPEED RAIL PROJECT							
2	ON MOTORIST AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY.							
3	(a) FINDING.—Congress finds that more than two							
4	dozen fatalities have taken place since the Virgin Trains							
5	project began in Florida in July 2017.							
6	(b) STUDY.—The Administrator of the Federal High-							
7	way Administration and the Administrator of the Federal							
8	Railroad Administration shall jointly conduct a study on							
9	the effects of the high-speed rail project carried out in							
10	Florida by Virgin Trains USA, or any successor operator,							
11	on motorist and pedestrian safety, including the safety of							
12	individuals attending schools that are within 1 mile of							
13	such rail project.							
14	(c) Report.—Not later than 2 years after the date							
15	of enactment of this Act, the Administrators described in							
16	subsection (b) shall submit to the Committee on Transpor-							
17	tation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives,							
18	the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation							
19	and the Committee on Environment and Public Works of							
20	the Senate, and the department of transportation of the							
21	State of Florida a report containing—							
22	(1) the results of the study required under sub-

24	(2) recommendations on how to improve motor-							
25	ist and pedestrian safety in the vicinity of the high-							
26	speed rail project studied under subsection (b) in-

- 2 improvements.
- 3 (d) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 4 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
- 5 essary to carry out this Act.
